## Holy Week & Easter 2012 Join Us for Worship and Invite a Friend!

We begin our Holy Week worship on Palm Sunday with joyful hosannahs filling the air as we process to the sanctuary waving palm branches. The mood turns somber with the reading of our Lord's passion from the Gospel of Mark. Thus, the tone is set for the quiet and contemplative services of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday when we remember our Lord's passion and death.

As the psalmist says, "Joy comes in the morning." On Easter, our "Alleluia" is let out of the box as we sing the joyful anthems celebrating our Lord's resurrection! Jesus has conquered sin and death and opened the way for us to join him in new resurrection life!

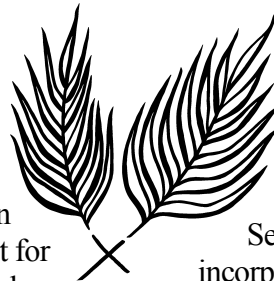
I cannot stress enough the significance of attending the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services to get the full impact of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. And do bring your children and grandchildren! Some of my best childhood church memories are of those very moving services. Children are struck by the visual and auditory aspects of worship, and they often understand more than we think! It's also a wonderful time to invite a friend or neighbor.



### Maundy Thursday, April 5 - 7 p.m.

On Maundy Thursday we remember our Lord's last supper and the new commandment he gave his disciples to love one another. This service will include several unique elements:

individual absolution with the laying on of hands; foot washing, worshippers giving Holy Communion to one another as you remain in your



chair rows, stripping of the altar as Psalm 22 is read, and departing in silence. Our choir has a beautiful anthem planned. Scripture readings, sermon, hymns and prayer complete the service.

### Good Friday, April 6, 7 p.m.

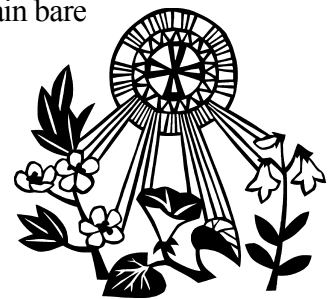
Several ancient Good Friday traditions are incorporated in this solemn Tenebrae Service. The Reproaches contrast God's goodness with the faithlessness of God's people. The Bidding Prayer is a series of bids, silences, and petitions and is followed by the Lord's Prayer.

Tenebrae is a Latin word that means "darkness" or "shadows." One of the most conspicuous features of the service is the gradual extinguishing of candles after each of seven readings about our Lord's seven last words uttered before his death. Finally, only a single candle, considered a symbol of our Lord, remains.

Amy Stollberg will grace us with a vocal solo during the service. There is no sermon or Communion and the altar and chancel remain bare of decoration.

### Easter Sunday, April 8 - 9:30 a.m.

We look forward with joy to celebrating our Lord's resurrection Sunday morning. All the great Easter hymns will be sung and a wonderful choir anthem heard. Amy Stollberg is seeking a trumpet player to accompany the hymns. The kids will let the Alleluia out of the box and we will all give thanks for forgiveness and salvation we receive by faith in Christ.

Congregational Council Meeting Minutes  
March 13, 2012

**Members present:** Bonnie Scranton; Dick Tabb; Jim Bailey; Judy Kauffman; Mary Reeve; Kathy Wolters; Pastor Gayle Pope. **Absent:** Bruce Holderbaum; Tom Holte; Ashley Maas; Donna Parke; Trish Santos; Sue McLennan

Opening prayer was provided by Pastor Gayle; Judy Kauffman led the devotion. Dick Tabb will lead devotions in April.

Meeting was called to order by President Scranton at 6:35 p.m. Minutes of the February 7, 2012 council meeting were approved as written. Motion by Jim Bailey; second by Judy Kauffman.

**Treasurer and Financial Secretary reports** were reviewed and approved to be filed for audit. Motion by Dick Tabb; second by Mary Reeve. Bonnie Scranton clarified that the payment of payroll taxes will be done in January for the previous year. She reported that the wine served for communion is paid by the church on the church's Hy-Vee charge card. The savings account balance sheet will have a line item for the capital improvement fund.

**President's Report:** no report.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Gayle distributed a printed report of her past month's activities to council members. She gave us a copy of the 2011 Parochial Report that must be submitted annually to the synod office.

**Ministry Team Reports:**

*Stewardship* – No report

*Service/Witness* – Mary Reeve requested the assistance of a mentor who is familiar with the duties of the two ministry teams. Mary announced that the Unmet Needs Committee of United Way meets regularly on the second Wednesday of the month with representatives from all local agencies and many area churches.

The past Sunday a reverse offering basket was started to gather foods for Easter baskets for needy families.

*Property* – No Report

*Worship* – Judy Kauffman announced that the worship committee met on March 8<sup>th</sup> and discussed worship leader training sessions. The team would like to schedule another training on Sunday morning for those who were unable to attend the other training sessions. Hymns have been selected through Palm Sunday. The team will be meeting to explore alternative worship times.

*Learning-* The youth choir had its first practice on Sunday, March 10<sup>th</sup> with Peggy Bailey. The youth Hang Out room will be open on Friday night March 16<sup>th</sup> for a fun night.

*Fellowship* – No Report

*Mutual Ministry* – Meeting was cancelled and has rescheduled it for April 24<sup>th</sup> to discuss shepherding circles.

Jim Bailey moved and Judy Kauffman seconded acceptance of all ministry team reports. Motion carried.

**Old Business**

**Strategic Planning Updates**

***Stewardship Team Report*** – Dick Tabb reported they met and have developed action steps for Objective 1.2 in which all members will be asked to take part in a spiritual gift assessment to increase spiritual giving. They are reviewing existing assessment tools and have a plan with target dates established.

***Executive Team Report*** – Bonnie Scranton indicated the executive committee has not met yet to discuss their assigned objectives

***Learning Team Report*** – Pastor shared the learning ministry team's action plans for Objective 1.1a on relationship building across generations through mentoring. Sue Reeder has agreed to lead this program, with the goal to have in underway by this fall. Pastor also reported on other activities that are underway to support other parts of Strategic Plan Objectives 1.1 and 1.5.

***Mutual Ministry Team Report*** – They are working on Objective 1.3 regarding formation of Shepherding Circles. Pastor previously submitted a plan for 1.7 regarding visitation ministers, but no action has yet been taken.

**Witness/Service Team Report** – No update.

**Worship Team Report** – Will be developing action steps on Objective 2.3 regarding alternative worship times and 2.4 regarding operations and training.

**Outdoor Cross** – Jim Bailey reported that the cross was in transit. It is scheduled to be delivered on this Thursday. The property team will coordinate putting the cross up.

**Updates to Facility Rental Agreement** (2005 and 2007) regarding use of the church by church members and non-members. Bonnie Scranton found minutes from the years of 2005 and 2007 that addressed the issues of rental agreements and alcohol usage in the facility.

In 2005 the church council approved charging non-members or for-profit organizations a \$75 fee for use of the fellowship hall. Members may use the facility free and are free to make a donation if they choose.

In 2007 the church council approved the following policy. The church will allow special exceptions to the no alcohol policy, upon approval of the council in a regular meeting, when an active member of the congregation is the responsible sponsor for the event and is present for the duration of the event. This approval is for moderate use of wine and beer only. The council expressed agreement with this policy by consensus. It will be forwarded to the Fellowship Team for consideration of any needed changes.

**Risk Management Update** – President Scranton, David Tooke, Stu Bell, Bruce Holderbaum, Sam Lathrop and Pastor Gayle met Feb. 25 to review the risk management recommendations from Cincinnati Insurance. Property Team has addressed many of those recommendations. On March 8, President Scranton, David Tooke, Sam Lathrop and Alan Steigelman met to review the first draft of Christ Lutheran Church's Risk Management Policy. Mary Reeve moved to make the risk management team a standing committee that reports to the church council. Motion was seconded and carried. They will be asked to be responsible for reviewing risk management policies, property insurance, emergency preparedness and other items deemed appropriate for this committee. All current members are willing to serve on the committee.

**Northwest Conference Assembly** – Pastor Gayle indicated that the church needs two representatives to attend the conference assembly at Christ Lutheran Church in Quincy on May 1 at 6:00 p.m. Our bishop will preach at worship and our choir will perform that evening. Fellowship Team will provide supper.

### **New Business**

**New members: Upon motion by Mary Reeve and second by Jim Bailey**, the council voted to confirm acceptance of the following new members: Brad Bliven; Sam Lathrop; Alan Steigelman; Virginia Powell (associate).

**Welcome Activity:** It was suggested that new members be recognized at a special activity of the church within 6 months of their joining the church. New members will be honored at the Easter Breakfast this April 8<sup>th</sup>. All new members will be invited to stand in line with the Pastor at the end of the service at which they become members. It was suggested that an article appear in the Seed introducing them to the congregation. The council would like to find a new member coordinator to assist with welcoming new members to our church.

**Virgene Gilkerson's Birthday** – Bonnie Scranton made a request to the council to seek their permission to serve champagne at Virgene's 90<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration on March 24, 2012. Dick Tabb moved and Jim Bailey seconded approval. Motion carried.

**New Financial Forms (request for reimbursement; fund raising deposits)** Bonnie Scranton shared two forms developed in consultation with Andrew Maas, Ashley Maas and Robin Lentz to keep better track of income from special events and expenditures. Judy Kauffman moved and Dick Tabb seconded to approve the forms. Motion carried. Forms will be in two different colors and available in the church mail box system.

**Confirmation Expectations** – Pastor Gayle asked the council what expectations they have for new confirmands prior to confirmation. The council would like for the confirmands to make an expression of their faith with the Pastor's assistance.

**Signing of Contracts** – Mary Reeve moved that all formal contracts should be approved by the church council and signed by either the President or Vice-President. Judy Kauffman seconded. Motion carried.

Church council handbooks were distributed to council members for their perusal. Next month they will be on the agenda for review and discussion.

**Adjournment** - Dick Tabb moved to adjourn and Mary Reeve seconded. Motion carried. Council adjourned at 8:25 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

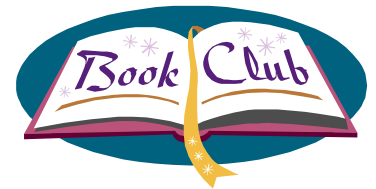

Our 2012 Super-Duper Garage Sale is set for Saturday, April 28 from 7 a.m. to 12 Noon.

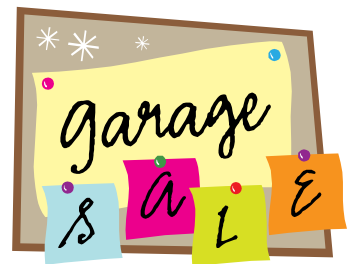
